Subject: PAS Build

PAS Build

This is to inform you that on the evening of Friday May 30th, a PAS build will be conducted. We anticipate that there will be no downtime or interruption to PAS access during this activity.

The following updates will be made to PAS during this build:

- NPAC validations will be turned on in PAS. (All of these validations may be overridden by selecting the override check box which is available after the validation error messages are provided by PAS.)
 - SPID Validation - The SPID is alpha-numeric and valid in the NPAC for the NPAC region where the block is to be entered.
 - LRN Validation - The LRN must be valid for the NPAC region where the block is to be entered and must be associated to the SPID listed on the Part 1B.
 - LATA Validation - The NPA-NXX and LRN must be in the same LATA.
- As a result of INC issue 583, Section D of the Thousands-Block MTE form has been modified to now read:

D. Quantity of numbers activated in the past 90 days (increments of 1,000 or 10,000) and excluded from the Utilization calculation²

 - New Footnote 2 created: *Quantity of numbers activated in the past 90 days is based on blocks and/or codes received from the administrator and shall be reported in increments of 1,000 or 10,000 TNs (e. g.: 2 blocks received=2,000 and 1 code received =10,000).*
- The block swap process has been modified in PAS to make the process more efficient. The following are the changes that affect what the SP/SPC users will now see in PAS:
 - After the PA has completed the block swap, the SP/SPC will receive a new work item in their work item summary for the new block number assigned. The new work item will be labeled "Block Swap" in the Summary column.
 - SP/SPC users will only see the new forms associated with the new block assigned when querying view forms or list forms. (The initial Part 3 will no longer be viewable).
- As a result of INC issue 586, a new PSTN check box has been added to the Part 1A form in Section 1.5. Users can now use this checkbox if they are willing to receive a "red" block (block not activated in PSTN...), rather than entering comments in the remarks field of the Part 1A or sending a separate email. The label next to the PSTN checkbox on the Part 1A form will show the following:
 - By selecting this checkbox, I acknowledge that I am willing to accept a block in red and explicitly understand that the underlying code may not be activated in the PSTN and loaded in the NPAC on the block effective date.
